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I. Introduction

The **State Library Administrative Agency (SLAA) Survey** is a voluntary survey conducted biennially by the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). The SLAA Survey collects data on SLAAs in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. IMLS collects these data under the authorization granted by the **Museum and Library Services Act of 2018** (PL 115-410), as stated in Section 210. The survey is a cooperative effort of the Chief Officers of State Library Agencies (COSLA); American Institutes for Research (AIR), the data collection agent; and IMLS.

The fiscal year (FY) 2024 survey is the 24th in the series. The survey was put on a biennial administration schedule beginning with the FY 2010 survey; before then, it was administered annually.¹

This user's guide provides detailed information on the SLAA Survey dataset pertaining to FY 2024. The data files include all SLAAs in the 50 states and the District of Columbia. The reporting unit for the survey is the SLAA. Each data file includes a total of 416 variables. Data files are available in SAS (.sas7bdat), comma-separated (.csv), and SPSS (.sav) formats. The data file record layout in Appendix A displays the layout of the data files and includes all of the variables contained therein.

Background

An SLAA is the official agency in a state with adequate authority under state law to administer state plans for libraries in accordance with the provisions of the Library Services and Technology Act (LSTA) (20 U.S.C. § 9121) of 2018. In addition to their critical role in assessing, planning, and coordinating library services and resources, SLAAs may provide important reference and information services to the state government, administer the state library or serve as the state archives, operate libraries for the blind and print disabled, and support the State Center for the Book. In some states, the SLAA also may function as a public library at large, providing library services to the general public.

Purpose of Survey

The purpose of the SLAA Survey is to provide state and federal policymakers and other interested users with information about SLAAs. The data collected are useful to Chief Officers of SLAAs; policymakers in the executive and legislative branches of federal and state governments; government and library administrators at the federal, state, and local levels; decision-makers who use this survey to obtain information about services and fiscal practices; the American Library Association and its members or customers; library and public policy researchers; and the public, journalists, and others. The data collected on services provided by SLAAs to public, academic, school, and special libraries, as well as library cooperatives—when combined with the data collected by the IMLS Public Libraries Survey (PLS)—provide a picture of library services that is nationwide in scope.

The legislative authorization to perform this data collection appears in Appendix B. IMLS library research activities are conducted in ongoing collaboration with SLAAs and other relevant agencies and organizations to extend and improve the nation's library and information services.

II. User's Guide to SLAA Data

Survey Methodology

Survey Universe

The survey universe includes the SLAAs in the 50 states and the District of Columbia (51 total). There was no sampling; the SLAA is a census survey.

The respondents for the FY 2024 SLAA Survey were employed at each of the states' SLAAs. Chief Officers of each SLAA designated one respondent, referred to as the Key Holder, to submit data for the survey. Data were submitted by the Key Holder and certified by the Chief Officers.

Web-Based Data Collection Tool and Questionnaire

The FY 2024 SLAA Survey data were collected in English over the internet via a web-based reporting system programmed in Qualtrics, a commercially available web survey platform. The survey was distributed to SLAAs via an email containing the link to the web survey on Qualtrics. IMLS and AIR provided respondents with a user's guide and instructions, the survey questionnaire, and a workbook containing FY 2022 submission values. A validation guide was also included in the user's guide and documented edit checks programmed into the survey to alert respondents to anomalies or inconsistencies in their data entries in order to resolve or explain them prior to submission.

The FY 2024 SLAA Survey collected data on items organized in 13 parts:

- A. SLAA Identification
- B. Governance
- C. Allied Operations, State Resource or Reference/Information Service Center, and State Center for the Book
- D. Services to Libraries and Library Cooperatives
- E. Public Service Hours, Outlets, and User Groups
- F. Collections
- G. Library Service Transactions
- H. Library Development Transactions
- I. Staff
- J. Revenue
- K. Expenditures
- L. LSTA State Program Expenditures
- M. Digital Services and Information

Data items and definitions are provided in the user's guide and instructions for completing survey items. Additional information on the questionnaire is provided in Appendix C.

Reporting Period

The FY 2024 SLAA Survey requested that respondents report data for the state's 2024 fiscal year, except for the items in Part B (Governance) and Part I (Staff), for which respondents were requested to report data as of October 1, 2024. The 2024 fiscal year for most states was July 1, 2023, to June 30, 2024. Five SLAAs had fiscal years with other start and end dates:

- New York: April 1, 2023–March 31, 2024
- Texas: September 1, 2023–August 31, 2024
- Alabama, District of Columbia, and Michigan: October 1, 2023–September 30, 2024

Survey Response Rate

Unit Response

The FY 2024 SLAA Survey achieved a 100 percent unit response rate; all 51 SLAAs provided data.

Item Response

Item response rates were calculated by dividing the total number of SLAAs reporting data for an item by the total number of SLAAs in the survey universe to which that item was presented.² All items had item response rates of 100 percent.

Data Collection and Processing

Data Collection

The FY 2024 SLAA Survey opened on January 27, 2025. The data collection was closed on March 25, 2025; however, three SLAAs requested extensions. The data submission for the final SLAA was completed in mid-November 2025. As the survey administrator and data-processing agent, AIR provided technical support to respondents, performed edit and nonresponse follow-up, and produced the data files and tabulations.

To reduce respondent burden, the survey was transmitted with select prior-year data pre-entered, including the state agency name and address (A-010 through A-120) and governance (Part B), based on FY 2022 SLAA Survey data. Fiscal years (A-230, A-240) were also prefilled based on 2022 data, with the years adjusted for the current cycle. The Key Holder was asked to review the pre-entered data and to update any information that had changed since the FY 2022 survey administration. The system also displayed prior-year responses in a non-editable, display-only field as a reference for all numeric data elements throughout the survey. All other data cells were left blank for respondents to complete. All items required a response, except those that followed a logical skip pattern. The system would not allow the respondent to submit and lock data unless the respondent answered or provided a justification if an answer was not available.

² The SLAA survey instrument contains a limited number of "logical skips" in which items are not presented due to the response to an earlier item. For example, some items are lists containing an "Other" option. If the "Other" option is not selected, respondents are not given an opportunity to enter further information. Values missing in the data files for this reason are so identified. The frequencies and percentages given in Appendix E, however, effectively report these logical skips as a valid, non-missing values.

Data Processing

To ensure accuracy, data were checked and edited, as necessary, during and after collection.

Data elements collected about the Chief Officer and the Key Holder (names and contact information included in Part A of the questionnaire) were removed from the final public data file. In addition, other data elements associated with administrative data collection processes were removed from the public data file.

Edit Checks During Data Collection

The survey program alerted respondents to potential errors in the data during the data entry process through interactive edit check warnings. The respondent was required to address these warnings through an edit check report, which could be viewed on-screen. The edit checks programmed within Qualtrics included several types of edits:

- Relational edit checks (data consistency checks between related data elements). For example, an edit message was generated if the SLAA was designated as a federal depository library, but the respondent did not enter data for the item on the type of federal depository library.
- Out-of-range edit checks (comparisons of data reported for an item to the “plausible range” of numeric values). For example, an edit message was generated if the respondent entered a value less than 0.5 for annual circulation transactions per annual library visit.
- Blank/zero/invalid edit checks (checks of reported data against acceptable values). For example, an edit message was generated if the respondent entered a value of 0 for the data element on the number of book/serial volumes.

Respondents were required to address all edit check warnings within Qualtrics prior to submitting their data.

Beginning in FY 2022, the web data collection system also included a feature that automatically calculated totals for most of the fields that are sums of other fields to reduce burden and ensure computational accuracy. The total values were displayed on screen to assist with data entry and saved as variable values in back-end data. Respondents did not have to manually calculate the values and enter them.

Post-Edit Processing

After respondents submitted their data, AIR performed additional edit checks or post-edit processing on the data. If any issues were identified, AIR emailed the respondent with a record of the issue and questions. Respondents were asked either to correct the data or to verify the data as correct. AIR analysts incorporated the edited data into the data file. This year, few issues needed to be addressed:

- Michigan: reported N/A for FIOTH1A. Because N/A is not an allowed value for this variable, it was recoded to “P” (Skip). The amount of AMT_FIOTH1A was also updated, changing 0 to -3 (Skip).
- Pennsylvania: reported 17120 0211 (ZIP+4) for both PHYSZIP and MAILZIP. Each value was updated to the standardized 5-digit ZIP code “17120” to ensure consistency across records.

- Virginia: reported N/A for OTHAGSP, FIOTH2A, and FIOTH3A. Because N/A is not an allowed value for these variables, each was recoded to “P” (Skip). The amounts AMT_FIOTH2A and AMT_FIOTH3A were also updated, changing 0 to –3 (Skip).
- Wisconsin: reported 53703-2760 (ZIP+4) for both PHYSZIP and MAILZIP. Each value was updated to the standardized 5-digit ZIP code “53703” to maintain consistency across records.

Imputation

No imputation was required for the FY 2024 data file because the item-level response rate was 100 percent.

Other Variables Added During Post-Edit Processing

Two additional variables were added to the data files to aid users in performing common analyses.

Region: The variable named OBEREGION represents the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) regions, which are listed in Table 1.

State Population: The variable named POPU_ST is the resident population derived from the 2020 Decennial Census.³

In previous survey administrations, the variable named ADMINGROUP about the SLAA administrative group was developed based on responses to four variables: BRANCH, INDAGY, LARGERAG, and OTHAGSP. Beginning in FY 2022, the SLAAs directly answered one question about the SLAA’s location in state government, and whether it is (1) Department of Administration or State, (2) Department of Education, (3) Independent or legislative agency, or (4) Other type of agency. For Other type of agency, SLAAs specified the agency name. The location in state government question was prefilled based on the ADMINGROUP value from the prior data collection cycle.

Nonsampling Error

Because all units in the universe were surveyed, these data are not subject to sampling error. However, the SLAA data are subject to nonsampling error, such as measurement and processing errors. Every effort has been made to mitigate such errors. The editing efforts described above are designed to decrease the number of errors due to inaccurate responses or processing problems. When necessary, imputation lessens the effect of nonresponse. Extensive quality control checks were performed, iteratively, by both AIR and IMLS.

Disclosure Limitation

The SLAA public data files contain no personally identifiable information (PII),⁴ but they do contain potentially sensitive information in the form of salary and benefits expenditures for those SLAAs with few employees. However, only Hawaii (4 full-time equivalent [FTE] staff) and the District of Columbia (4 FTE staff) have fewer than 10 FTE staff. IMLS does not require that associated expenditures be suppressed or altered in order to protect confidentiality.⁵

Using the Data

The SLAA Survey Public-Use Data File

IMLS provides one public-use data file for this survey (slaa2024). The data file is provided in multiple formats: SAS (.sas7bdat), comma-delimited (.csv), and SPSS (.sav). The FY 2024 SLAA Survey public-use data file consists of 51 records, one for each SLAA. The data file has 416 variables.

Comparisons of FY 2024 Data to Prior-Year Data

State comparisons should be made with caution because states vary in their fiscal year reporting periods and may vary in their interpretation of the survey items. Similarly, the District of Columbia, although not a state, is included in the survey.

When applicable, missing data were imputed beginning with the FY 1999 survey. Data users should take into consideration that items that include imputations are not strictly comparable to data from surveys prior to FY 1999.

Changes to FY 2024 Data Collection

In spring 2024, AIR and IMLS convened a Technical Review Panel (TRP), which consisted of Key Holders, Chief Officers, State Data Coordinators, and other members of the Library Statistics Working Group (LSWG). The TRP met three times to review the prior (FY 2022) survey materials and assess the value of potential changes for FY 2024 survey collection. Recommendations focused on aligning the SLAA Survey with approved changes made to the Public Libraries Survey (PLS) and improving the quality and clarity of the data elements and collection instructions. Recommendations did not change the nature or intent of the information collection. IMLS and AIR presented results from the TRP sessions to the LSWG in summer 2024. Final changes were submitted to OMB for approval. The changes to the SLAA FY 2024 data collection instrument and supporting materials are summarized below:

- Deleted six data elements from the survey instrument (see **Table 2**).
- Added five data elements and revised six data elements in the survey instrument (see **Table 2**).
- Revised the SLAA Web-Based Data Collection Tool User’s Guide and Instructions to match changes to the instruments and improve the clarity of instructions.
- Merged the SLAA Web-Based Data Collection Tool User’s Guide and Instructions into one document to eliminate redundancies and ease burden for respondents.

Appendix B—Legislative Authorization

The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) collects these data as authorized by its congressional mandate, the Museum and Library Services Act of 2018, as stated in 20 U.S.C. § 9108 (Policy research, data collection, analysis and modeling, evaluation, and dissemination):

(a) In general

The Director shall regularly support and conduct, as appropriate, policy research, data collection, analysis and modeling, evaluation, and dissemination of information to extend and improve the Nation's museum, library, and information services.

(b) Objectives

The objectives of the policy research, data collection, analysis and modeling, evaluation, and dissemination of information carried out under this section include the following:

- (1) To enhance and expand the capacity of museums, libraries, and information services to anticipate, respond to, and meet the evolving needs of communities and the public, including by identifying trends and developments that may impact the need for and delivery of services.
- (2) To provide information and data on the role, value, and impact of museum, library, and information resources, including the identification of trends and potential gaps in the availability and use of museum and library services by their communities and the public.
- (3) To measure the effectiveness of museums, libraries, and information services throughout the United States, including the impact of Federal programs authorized under this Act.
- (4) To identify indicators and outcomes that can be used to create enhancements to the efficiency and efficacy of museum, library, and information services.
- (5) To promote advancement and growth in museum, library, and information services through sharing of best practices and effective strategies in order to better serve the people of the United States.
- (6) To facilitate planning for, and building of, institutional capacity in order to improve—
(A) museum, library, and information services at the national, State, local, and regional levels; and
(B) international communications and cooperative networks.
- (7) To support and enhance collaborative professional networks and consortia that use shared, meaningful, and actionable data analysis and modeling to advance museum, library, and information services and address community needs.

(c) Authority to contract and enter into other arrangements

The Director is authorized to enter into grants, contracts, cooperative agreements, and other arrangements with Federal agencies, public and private organizations, and other entities with expertise the Director determines appropriate, to further the objectives described in subsection (b) and to carry out the responsibilities under subsection (f).

(d) Consultation and Public Engagement

In carrying out subsection (a) and in furtherance of the objectives described in subsection (b), the Director—

(8) shall conduct ongoing collaboration (as determined appropriate by the Director) and consult with—

(A) State library administrative agencies; and

(B) National, State, tribal, and regional museum and library organizations; and

(9) may also collaborate or consult with—

(C) cooperative networks of geographic- or discipline-based museums and libraries; and

(D) Other applicable agencies, organizations (including international organizations), entities (including entities with expertise in the fields of data collection, analysis and modeling, and evaluation), and community stakeholders.

(e) Assistance to museums and libraries

The Director shall provide technical support and assistance (and other resources, to the extent practicable) to ensure consistency in data reporting and help the museum and library fields with meeting the objectives of this section.

(f) Dissemination

(10) In general—

(11) Each year, the Director shall widely disseminate, as appropriate to further the objectives described in subsection (b)—

(E) the results, data, reports, findings, studies, surveys, and other information obtained under this section;

(F) the means and approaches by which the objectives described in subsection (b) were accomplished; and

(G) information regarding the manner and extent to which collaboration and consultation were conducted, as required by subsection (d).

(12) Formats to be used—

The information described in paragraph (1) shall be shared in formats that facilitate access and ease of use and are searchable.

(g) Authorization of appropriations

(13) In general

There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section \$3,500,000 for each of the fiscal years 2020 through 2025.

(14) Availability of funds

Sums appropriated under paragraph (1) for any fiscal year shall remain available for obligation until expended.
