

Best Practices in Reporting and Assessing Projects

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SPR Performance Measurement

- Limited set of subject-neutral measures for national-level reporting
- At the activity (not project) level
- Designated questions align with PLA's *Project Outcome*
- Outcomes involve concrete gains:
 - Knowledge
 - Confidence
 - Behavior change
 - Awareness



Designated Questions (see handout for more)

- Instruction (Program) for the Public
 - I learned something by participating in this library activity.
 - I feel more confident about what I just learned.
 - I intend to apply what I just learned.
 - I am more aware of resources and services provided by the library.
 - I am more likely to use other library resources and services.
- **Response options:** Strongly Disagree, Disagree, Neither Agree nor Disagree, Agree, Strongly Agree (or Non-response)
