Who is OGPM?

- Handles all the financial aspects of the awards

 obligation, payment, closeout
- Engages with the Program Offices to design and implement the funding opportunities

Federal Grant Making

- Twenty-six Federal agencies provide grants to fulfill a public service purpose
- All use some form of a grants management system tied to their grant lifecycle
- The link between them is Grants.gov
- New IMLS System-eGMS


Background on Grants.gov



- Established in 2002, managed by HHS as an e-government initiative
- Central federal government repository for 1000 different grant programs offering \$500 billion annually; usage is required
- Used to be a list of funding opportunities, now an electronic workspace for grant application submissions
- Linked to other federal grants reporting systems
 - USA Spending
 - SAM.gov
 - Reg.gov

- Overview of eGMS modules to manage different parts of the grant life cycle
 - Peer Review Process
 - Institutional records
 - Grant Program records
 - Grantee Application records
 - Grant record management
 - People records and communication (REACH)



Benefits of eGMS

- Established technical solution

 - National Endowment for the Arts (NEA)
 - National Trust for Historic Preservation



Additional eGMS Benefits

- Direct input of grant application information from Grants.gov to eGMS
- Central repository for all forms and communication between grantees and IMLS
- Management of the peer review process for discretionary grant programs
