

- Moved offices in March 2016









Competitive Library Grants

- Laura Bush 21st Century Librarian Program
- National Leadership Grants for Libraries
 - NEW: 2 deadlines per year (fall / winter)
 - NEW: Initial two-page concept paper

Continued Funding Priorities

- Early childhood learning
- Digital capacity building
- STEM Science Technology Engineering Math







Emerging Funding Priorities

- Community anchors to catalysts (the transformed role of museums and libraries)
- Building capacity in collections care, conservation, and preservation skills
- Community-based solutions for veterans and military families







Pacific Investments - 2013

- SEED Successful Early Eco-literacy Development by Pacific Resources for Education and Learning
- Childhood literacy curriculum focused on local food and cultivation practices and nutrition
- Goal: close the reading gap for third grade students in Majuro (RMI) and Kosrae (FSM)





Pacific Investments - 2015

- LEAP-II by University of North Texas with Brigham Young University—Hawaii
- Three-year master's degree program in library and information science to increase the number of degreed library professionals in the Pacific





Other Recent Investments

- Open eBooks launched February 2016
- e-reader app that makes thousands of popular eBooks available to children in need for free
- iOS 8.0 or later (Apple) and Android
- Partners

Open eBooks Eligibility

- Qualifying orgs (including libraries) who work with lowincome children, sign up at: <u>firstbook.org/openebooks</u>
- At least 70% of the children you serve come from low-income families; or if you partner with local Title I school, nearby Head Start, food pantry or other agency to deliver programming through your library (can register for those participants)
- Once signed up, request access codes for Open eBooks at <u>fbmarketplace.org/openebooks</u>
- Receive code/PIN combo to share with low-income children

- Investigation of how public libraries are delivering summer learning activities
