Omnibus Projects



Rationale

- Comparable and consistent data across states
- Tell a cohesive story about Grants to States
- Share your successes (and failures) within your state and across the country
- Build a community of practice to enable continuous improvement & gather evidence of what works



Common Omnibus Projects

- Youth Development Programs
- Children's Services
- Outreach Services/Services to Underserved Populations
- Library Development Programs

Key Questions

- What are the activities?
- Can you assign a specific intent to each activity?
- Can the activities be grouped by intents?
- Are the ultimate beneficiaries the same?
- Are there specific initiatives that could be called out? (e.g., summer reading)

Example of Omnibus Project

The Youth Services Consultant at the West Dakota State Library (SLAA) led efforts to increase participation in lifelong learning activities for children and teens in the state.

The SLAA:

- Provided training to library staff on designing effective summer reading programs for all youth ages 0-12;
- Purchased and distributed summer reading manuals to 45 libraries across the state;
- Provided 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten training to library staff around the state to promote school readiness;
- Acquired and distributed 10,000 children's books to Head Start locations across the state;
- Subscribed to an online homework help service;
- Coordinated a series of financial literacy programs for teens.

Project 3: Homework Help

Intent:

Improve users' formal education

Activity:

- Instruction - Consultation

Project 4: Financial Literacy

Intent:

Improve users' ability to apply information that furthers their personal, family, or household finances

Activity:

- Instruction - Program

Tips for Dissecting Projects

- Review the projects in your portfolio
- For each project, list all of the associated activities
- Map each of your activities to an intent
- Identify projects containing activities that map to multiple intents
