**Statement of Need** Libraries serving rural communities are working against trends of decline: people, human service agencies, government offices all have dwindling presence in rural centers (<u>Liberto, 2012</u>; <u>Maron, 2017</u>). In these human service deserts, librarians face many of the same challenges faced by agencies that have already closed, including decreases in tax base, philanthropic interest, and intellectual capital (<u>Lindsay, 2017</u>). As public librarians, we we seek ways to improve mutualism between libraries and communities - to not abandon them as other institutions have. We note restricted access to peer-reviewed literature, low volume of library case studies in rural communities, lack of information on the relationship between cost, community type, and library type, and depressed ability due to resource limitations to independently develop changes in practice from published research-based recommendations (<u>Real, et al, 2014</u>). Therefore, we ask, how do public libraries sustain or improve service in resource poor geographies?

The Southern Tier Library System (STLS), in partnership with the Chautauqua Cattaraugus Library System (CCLS), Pioneer Library System (PLS), and Association for Rural and Small Libraries (ARSL) seeks \$247,920 in funding to: conduct literature analysis, gather data, and do field research, the findings of which will inform the development of practical, accessible tool-kits for rural library workers and boards. These findings and tool-kits will be widely shared throughout the rural library community.

**Project Design** Work like the recent report "<u>Strengthening Networks</u>, <u>Sparking Change</u>" from the IMLS does the first step of making connections between communities and libraries. While the work indicates how the research might be implemented in libraries & museums in "III. Understanding Assets and Challenges, and Evaluating Impact" (p.29) there are no clear connection to rural conditions. To overcome the specific challenges posed by conditions of resource poverty rural librarians face, these conditions must be fully understood such that this past work can be built upon and all research findings can be translated for practical impactful action.

As public library practitioners, the team has very little interaction with formal research and has a low experience level in conducting research studies. To develop the methodology in a sound and inclusive way, Rick Bonney of Cornell University and Miriam Jorgensen, Director, University of Arizona's Native Nations Institute, will work with us. They are passionate about libraries, and have a wealth of complimentary methodologist experiences.

Diversity Plan The team will include: Margo Gustina, STLS Deputy Director and rural libraries consultant, Eli Guinnee, CCLS Executive Director, and Hope Decker, PLS Member Service Liaison. We public librarians on the team serve some of New York's most resource impoverished communities and struggle to answer the questions in this research project. We seek these answers so that we might save the last civic institutions in our communities in need

Because we live and serve in Rust Belt communities, we will need assistance from an advisory panel to ensure that the specific social conditions of rurality and library service in diverse localities are respectfully captured, and the products of the research are of practical use within these diverse community libraries. Meredith Wickham, an ARSL board member, will assist in developing the advisory board and lead comment and feedback cycles. Our research and products will include rural communities of all types, including American Indian communities, the rural Black Belt in the southern US, and the Borderlands.

**Broad Impact** At the conclusion of the Rural Library Service - Conditions, Resources, Regeneration study, the tools developed for librarians and library trustees will allow them to make decisions based on information and data, rather than assumptions about practice and service in rural regions in the United States.

**Budget Narrative** The cost estimate of \$247,920 is based on estimates for the cost of access to published research (\$3,000), researcher salaries (\$144,920), stipends for research advisors (\$75,000), travel for research and presentation (\$25,000). As public librarians, we have no access to most peer-reviewed publications, our regions of study are in isolated and diverse geographies to which travel is costly, and in an effort to include librarians who serve patrons across the full spectrum of rural communities, we need advisors in addition to the core work team.
